Overview

The MSc. Counselling Programme is a two-year blended Masters programme offered by The Hugh Wynter Fertility Management Unit, The UWI, Mona, supported by the Mona Campus and the Faculty of Medical Sciences, Mona.  - 2. Developmental Psychology/Lifespan Psychology

(At least a 'B' Average obtained from an accredited institution within the last five years).

- Statement of Intent

Some applicants may be selected for an entrance interview.
