BACKGROUND INFORMATION

By 2050 about **90 million** of the 131 million expected to develop dementia will be **from LMICs**.

The Caribbean and Latin American population is one of the **fastest ageing populations** according to the WHO.

In **Jamaica** there are a **suspected 41,000 persons** living with dementia, which far surpasses the 2010 estimate of 19,000 and is likely to increase exponentially due to **rapid population ageing**.
