





About the Degree

The Online MSc. in Development Studies is designed to produce graduates with specialized leadership skills for development and an interdisciplinary grasp of the Social Sciences.

It will:

• Expose students to recent social, economic and political developments, especially in small developing countries

• Facilitate an understanding of the principles and practices of policy formulation, implementation and evaluation

• Equip students to use quantitative and qualitative techniques in decision-making; and

• Equip students with the skills to undertake research in policy analysis.

In addition to a firm grounding in contemporary social, political and economic affairs, the degree features a novel leadership seminar, a practical incourse approach to research methodology and a technical writing seminar.

Programme Features

Students are required to enrol in the General Degree or one of three Concentrations at the start of the programme:

1. Master of Science in Development Studies (Social Development Policy)

2. Master of Science in Development Studies (Economic Development Policy)

3. Master of Science in Development Studies (Governance and Public Policy)

Generally, courses are offered in asynchronous mode – to allow students to study at their own pace during each Semester/Term. However, in some courses, facilitators may offer synchronous sessions to facilitate special guest lectures, panel discussions, interactive discussions and group presentations by students.

Admission Requirements

The minimum requirement for admission shall normally be a Lower Second Class Honours degree (GPA 2.5) or its equivalent. Pass degrees may be considered, if the candidate has relevant and substantive work experience.

Completed application inclusive of:

- Two (2) Academic Referees' reports
- Transcript (Non-UWI graduates)
- Birth Certificate (Non-UWI graduates)
- Marriage Certificate (if relevant and if not already submitted to UWI)
- Resume

Interview and satisfactory diagnostic test result may be required.
